GENERAL RULES

1. All entries must be property of the exhibitor.
2. Check in time for all exhibits is Sunday, October 5, 2008 from 1:30-5:00p.m.
3. Entries will be released only on Sunday, October 12, 2008 between the hours of 1:30-5:00p.m. (All animals must stay the entire week.)
4. Animals may only be left after 5:00p.m. on Sunday, October 12th by prior arrangement with the Pet and Poultry Barn Coordinator. *Any unclaimed animals for which prior arrangements have not been made will be considered abandoned and will be sold or given away.*
5. Any sick animal will be removed from the show and cared for at the exhibitors expense.
6. Neither the Elberton 12-County Fair nor the Pet and Poultry Barn Coordinator will be responsible for any loss that may occur. We will provide the best attention possible. All stock will be fed and watered twice daily.
7. Any and all decisions of the judges will be final. No protest as to placement etc. will be entertained unless same is made in writing and accompanied by \$5.00. In case protest is sustained, money will be returned.
8. All exhibits entered will remain on display through Saturday of the Fair week and may not be removed without permission of the Pet Show Superintendent.
9. The Fair Pet Show Superintendent has the right to limit the number of entries in any group in case of room shortage and cage space.
10. Displays will be judged on beauty, coordination and originality. Entries for ducks, geese, pheasants, and guineas must be four or more per pen. Trophies and ribbons will be awarded for best displays.
11. Any animals that are for sale should be declared at check-in time. The Fair and the department Superintendent will assist these individuals, however, we accept no responsibility for these sales.
12. Standard feed will be provided by the fair for each animal exhibited. An exhibitor may provide special feed for his animal(s), and the staff will feed the animal(s), unless and exhibitor desires to feed his own animal.
13. All animals must have vet inspection papers.
14. Forms should be submitted by October 4, 2008.

HEALTH INSPECTION

Per Georgia law, all animals are subject to Health Inspection, including, but not limited to blood testing. All chickens will be blood tested for pullorum-typhoid. A state veterinarian will do this at the Fairgrounds. Any bird that tests positive will be quarantined. No goats will be allowed entry into the show barn without proper health records and tests. The State of Georgia requires:

1. Georgia and out-of-state goats must enter a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with the following Statement recorded: "No evidence of footrot, scabies, or sore mouth.
2. Dairy goats six months of age or older must have a negative brucellosis within 30 days and a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days except those dairy goats originating from a certified brucellosis free herd and an accredited tuberculosis free herd. Certification and accreditation numbers and date of last herd test must be recorded on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Pet and Small Stock Department (continued)

CLASSES

Poultry (Standard Breeds)

Large standard chickens, ducks, geese, etc. will be judged in singles, pairs, trios, and pens of four or more. Judging will be based upon the American Poultry Association 's American Standards of Perfection. Ribbons and trophies will be given to winners.

Bantam (All Breeds)

Bantams will be shown in their breed classes: cochins, cornish, sebrights, polish, etc. Bantams are shown as singles. Trophies and ribbons will be given to winners. Also champion of the show will win a trophy. Judging will be based upon the American Poultry Association's American Standards of Perfection.

Pigeons, Doves, and all Types of Songbirds.

Special display of songbirds or jungle-type birds must have their own special cages. Pigeons will have to be seamless banded as to year of hatch. Trophies and ribbons will be given to winners.

Rabbits and Guinea Pigs

Classes will be shown in juniors and seniors , both bucks and does and also, litters, pairs, and trios. Ribbons and trophies will be given to winners.

Goats

Goats will be judged individually. Classes will include dwarfs, meat-type and dairy breeds, depending on the number of entries. Ribbons and trophies will be given to winners.

Cows-Pigs-Sheep

Any Animal - any age as long as it is friendly and socialized.
