

## GENERAL RULES

1. All persons making entries should acquaint themselves with the rules pertaining to that department.
2. Competition in all departments is open to residents of the Elberton 12-County Fair Area, consisting of Georgia counties: Elbert, Hart, Franklin, Madison, Banks, Oglethorpe, Wilkes, Lincoln, Clarke, Stephens, and South Carolina counties: Anderson and Abbeville.
3. The Elberton 12-County Fair Association will not be responsible for the loss or damage of property on exhibit, but the Association and those in charge will exert every precaution for its protection.
4. Without a license from the Fair Manager, no selling of any kind or distribution of advertising matter will be allowed.
5. Ample display equipment will be arranged by the Association, but special shelving, counters, fittings, etc., which Exhibitor may require, must be furnished at the expense of the Exhibitor.
6. In making entries for competition purposes, it is necessary to give the name of the article, the name and address of the Exhibitor and the premium number of the article. Entries made in person will receive the complimentary 1 day pass. If delivered by Proxy a 1 day pass will **not** be given.
7. **Entries will be received starting Tuesday October 12th, 2021 from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., Through Wednesday October 13th, 2021 from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. prior to the Fair opening.**
8. All entries will be numbered on registration forms, with corresponding entry tags issued; and the tags attached to the exhibit prior to exhibition.
9. Any entry or application may be rejected or accepted conditionally at the discretion of the Fair Association.
10. All entries will remain on display through Saturday night, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2021. **Exhibits and booths may be removed from the exhibit building between 12:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 24<sup>th</sup> between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., and on Monday October 25<sup>th</sup> 9:00a.m. - 5:00p.m. following the close of the Fair.**
11. The Fair will not be responsible for any articles which are not claimed for after 5:00 p.m. on Monday following the close of the Fair.
12. Premiums are paid only in accordance with the official award books and are payable Sunday or Monday at the time exhibits are picked up. Entry receipt **must** be presented upon removing exhibits and receiving prize money.
13. Exhibitors will make only one entry in each class unless Exhibit Chairman states otherwise.
14. No one directly or indirectly involved with Fair entries will be allowed to serve as a judge and decisions of the Judges shall be final.
15. All judging, except for livestock exhibits, will be completed by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 14th, 2021.

16. General Exhibit Premiums are as follows: 1<sup>st</sup> Place - \$4.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> Place - \$3.00, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place - \$2.00.
17. Second place prize money will be awarded in all classes which have only one entry.
18. No judge of any department or any member of his or her immediate family will be allowed to exhibit in his or her department.
19. Educational booths will be assigned as requests are received.
20. Entries which have previously been entered in the Elberton 12-County Fair are **ineligible** for entry in the 2021 Fair.

## **COMMUNITY/YOUTH CLUB BOOTH EXHIBITS**

Booths may be Community, Agricultural, Home Economics, or Club Booths, such as FHA, FFA, 4-H, or Scouts. Each booth is to be educational, informative, filled with a variety of quality products, arranged in an attractive manner, and tied in with the 2021 Fair theme to bring out a timely message. The purpose of these booths shall be to illustrate better home and community programs.

Booths can be put up on Saturday Oct 9<sup>th</sup> -Wednesday Oct 13<sup>th</sup>-, between 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. These booths will be judged on Thursday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Booths can be removed between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 24<sup>th</sup> and between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Monday, October 25<sup>th</sup>. Any booth removed prior to the end of the fair on Saturday night will not receive prize money. See page 12 for booth sizes and premiums.

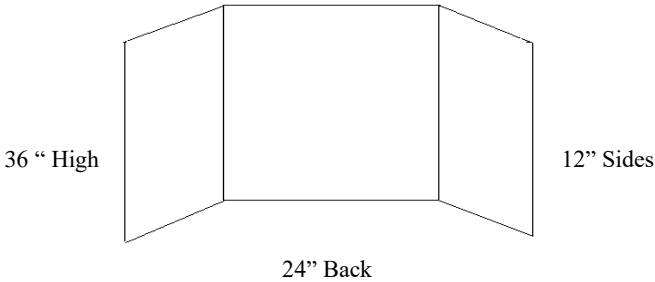

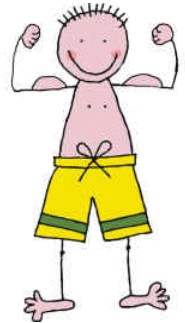

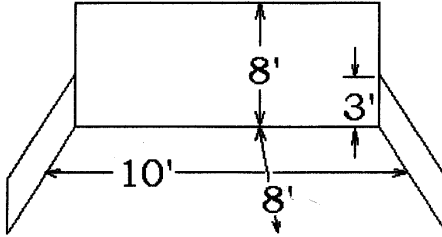
